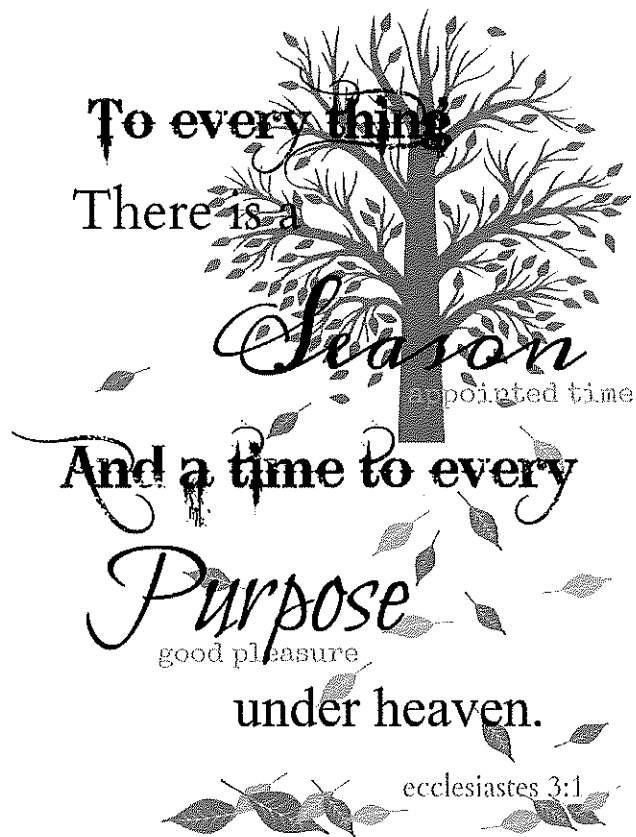

## 2022 Association Mission Strategists Report

Over the next seven years our community is projected to continue to grow in population and it will continue to grow in lostness. In Cabarrus County, 2 out of 3 people do not attend church anywhere. When asked less than 1 out of 5 people living in our community will say that their faith is very important to them. If this trend is going to change in our community it will only happen if local churches are on mission together with God to redeem a lost world.

As an association we prioritize the local church because it is God's priority. We seek to assist churches to maximize their kingdom potential. There has been set a 7-year goal to have 30 churches living out their 5+ year vision to make disciples and reach our community with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We want to see the rest of our churches somewhere in the process of developing that vision. The goal is called, 30 by 30.

To do this we believe the answers are not in a program, but in the Holy Spirit working through the members and leaders of our churches. We believe that our churches can help our churches. Our pastors can help our pastors.

In January 2023, we will begin working with The Vision Pathway Co.:Lab which will equip a leadership team to take their church through the Vision Pathway to determine their Disciple-Making Vision, to determine their Kingdom Concept, to develop their vision frame and to deploy their implementation plan. Each team will also walk away with relationships with other church teams who are taking the same journey as they work together.

We are developing pathways for our pastors with other pastors so that we can connect the strengths that God has already given us as an association of churches.

Our next step is to seek ways to assist our churches in creating and deploying their own unique leadership pipeline to develop leaders and make disciples in their church.

We are building means by which every church in our association can be partnering together in church planting and/or church revitalizations. It is our desire to see every church involved in a church planting/church revitalization partnership not only here but around the world.

It is our commitment to prioritize the local church leadership because the local church is God's priority, promoting transformation because the Gospel demands it, practical excellence because the church needs the best resources and to practice unity because we are stronger together.

**Nominating Committee report:** Motion was made to approve the Nominating Committee Report.

**2021 Budget proposal:** Tom Gibbs presented the 2021 Budget Proposal and ask for a vote of the budget proposal no opposition it passes.

**Association Missions Strategist Report:** Jimmy Barrett and Steve Davis shared what the association has been working on the past year and planning for the future.

**Evangelism Training to reach children:** We feel that with different Vacation Bible School curriculum being offered, our focus will more towards Evangelism Training to reach children. In Spring of 2022, we will no longer offer Vacation Bible School Trainings. Evangelism Training to reach children for Christ.

**Disciples of Christ Church:** Pastor Barry Matos felt let to start a satellite church in Spencer. He has been meeting at First Baptist Church of Spencer and currently have 45 coming. The community has requested an English-speaking service, so he is starting a second service.

**Church Plant:** We do have another church planter coming in 2022 name is Ian Kitchen, and he is going to be planting in pocket 55, which is somewhere in Kannapolis. One of the things that we are trying to do now with our church plants, that every church plant will come out of a local church, already, so that they will be sponsored by one of our churches, so we are working towards that.

**Counseling Center Report:** Mental Health needs continue to grow, our counselors are serving between the 3 of them 100 to 111 hours a month, through both in person and tele-health sessions. The association also wants to encourage Pastor’s use our counseling services if they need to and the association will cover the cost of their counseling.

**Baptist Sharing House Report:** Over the last year have ministered to over 1,000 families per month and there have been over 30 salvations.

**South Piedmont Pastor’s Network:** A network of young pastor’s started this year. This network was started to connect young pastors and to provide training that would benefit them in their ministry. They are currently going through a study by Adriane Rogers, “What Every Pastor Should Know”. We’re looking at expanding that into a residency program and working alongside Metrolina and Union Associations.

**Great Commission Grants:** A few years ago, the association created a program called Great Commission Grants. The purpose of these grants is to encourage evangelism projects among our churches in their communities. Churches can apply for these grants online and they can receive up to \$500 (one time per calendar year).
